By signing this form, I certify that I have read and understood CTF Rule 19 as it applies to participating in this competition and the effect my participation may have on my CTF Youth eligibility. I understand that by accepting any of the prizes listed above, I am in violation of CTF Rule 19, which subjects me to disciplinary action including the potential loss of my CTF Youth eligibility.

I further understand that by accepting any of the prizes listed above, my eligibility to complete in high school and collegiate athletics may be jeopardized. I also understand that to ensure compliance with high school and collegiate rules, I should check with a compliance officer and/or athletic/activities association prior to the acceptance of any award.

CTF Youth Division
 Rule 19*. For membership in the CTF Youth Division, individuals shall not have reached their 22nd birthday on or before August 1 of the current bowling season. The age limitation is waived for those authorized as mentally challenged.
 If a CTF Youth member participates in any bowling activity recognized by his/her Provincial High School Athletic Association, the more restrictive eligibility rule (CTF Youth or Provincial High School Athletic Association) will apply.
 To maintain eligibility, youth bowlers must not bowl, substitute or pace in any bowling activity where:
 a. They are involved in any form of gambling.
 b. Cash or bonds of any amount, or merchandise exceeding \$500 in value, are awarded for bowling accomplishments.
EXCEPTION: Youth may bowl in CTF sanctioned or USBC sanctioned ADULT SINGLES COMPETITIONS (Including side competitions/brackets) offering such prizes, provided, prior to bowling:
 1. The competition agrees to award the youth's prize in the form of a scholarship deposited in the CTF SAFE Program, or in the case of USBC-sanctioned competition, the USBC Smart Program, or
 2. The youth signs a form waiving his/her rights to any prize in violation of this rule
 Buying or selling of earned awards is prohibited.
 Penalty: Membership may be suspended or denied to any youth bowler who participates in any activity involving Items a, or b. (See Rule 800 for disciplinary procedures.)
 NOTE: There are no limits on scholarship amounts or entry fees (must be paid directly to the tournament director/manager) and reimbursement of actual travel expenses into the next higher level of competition of any tournament or event. (Receipts must be provided upon request.)
 NOTE: CTF youth leagues and tournaments may adopt rules prohibiting the promotion of alcohol and tobacco products.
