**ALBERTA AND ONTARIO MEMBERS NAMED NEWEST INDUCTEES INTO CANADIAN  
TENPIN FEDERATION'S HALL OF FAME**

Lil Hilton of Edmonton, Alberta and Joyce Woolgar of Norval, Ontario have been named the 15th and 16<sup>th</sup> members of the Canadian Tenpin Federation Hall of Fame. Woolgar will be honoured in the Builders category during a ceremony to be held in London, Ontario during the Annual General Meeting on April 17, 2004. Hilton will be inducted in the Veterans category during the opening ceremonies of the CTF Championships that will take place in Calgary, Alberta May 21, 2004.

Hilton was a member of the Team Canada from 1971-1979 and represented Canada at two Zone and two World Championships. She competed at the World Championships in Milwaukee, Wisconsin in 1971, the first time that Canada was represented with a full team at the world event. Her best finish at Milwaukee was a fifth place in the doubles. Hilton earned a silver medal in the four-woman team event and a bronze medal in the five-woman team event at the American Zone Championships held in Caracas, Venezuela in 1974. Her next international stop was Panama City, Panama in 1977 and she earned another silver and bronze medal in the five woman team and doubles with partner Shirley Mickosky and a ninth place finish in the women's all events. Hilton's final international event was the 1979 World Championships held in Manila, Philippines where she finished 10<sup>th</sup> in the trios event. A member of the Edmonton Women's Tenpin Bowling Association, Hilton won many local association tournament titles during the 60's, 70's and 80s and was honoured by the City of Edmonton for her international bowling achievements. She also served as a volunteer for the sport. Hilton coached in the youth league and served on the board of directors - three years as association secretary.

Woolgar, a CTF Life member, has served the tenpin bowling community at the national and provincial level. She represented the Ontario women bowlers on the CTF board for 14 years. She served as CTF 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President for eight years and CTF Treasurer for five years. Woolgar was the Team Manager for the Canadian team at the American Zone Championships held in Panama in 1977 and represented Canada at the American Zone meeting. She coordinated the formation of the Ontario Bowling Council and has served as its' President for 22 years. Her honours include the Ontario Provincial Women's Bowling Association Hall of Fame in the Meritorious Service category and the Greater Toronto Associations Hall of Fame in the Contributor to the Sport category. She also received the Ontario Ministry of Culture, Tourism and Recreation Special Achievement Sports Award for her work as a volunteer.
