I help to organize and run Tournaments “Montreal Fall Classic” with Joe Nunes in the 1990’s.

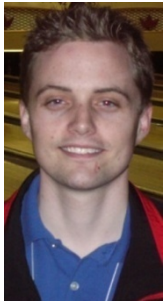
