COLOMBIA WINS DOUBLES GOLD AT WORLD YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIPS

Colombia won the gold medal in the women's doubles event at the under 20 World Youth Championships in a close match over Singapore 2 with a score of 481 - 473. Singapore earned the silver medal.

The biennial event is taking place at Tali Bowl in Helsinki, Finland from July 25th - August 1st.

A one-game semi-final and final decided the medals. The #1 doubles team after six games met #4 and #2 met #3 in the semi-final. The winners of the semi-final matches met for the gold and silver medals. The losers both earned bronze.

In the semi-final matches, the #4 finisher Singapore 2 beat #1 Korea 456 – 414 and #3 Colombia won over #2 Singapore with a score of 412 – 392.

Singapore 1 and Korea were both awarded bronze medals.

Canada's doubles team of Carrie Hopkinson, Drumbo, Ontario and Valerie Calberry, Brampton, ON finished in 29th place with a six game total of 2273.

They had a roaring start with 461 in game one but were unable to keep up the scoring pace. Hopkinson bowled 247 in game one.

Karyne Legault, Sarnia, ON and Marie-Eve Robertson, St. Jerome, Quebec finished 46th. Their six game total was 1992.
