MANITOBA WINS THE MEDAL RACE AT 28TH CTF YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIPS

Manitoba earned 17 medals (eight gold, four silver and five bronze) at the 28th CTF Youth Championships. This was the highest medal count of any province. Southern Ontario was next with 15 and Quebec earned 13.

Southern Ontario continues to lead all other provinces in overall medals earned since 1972 with 377. Quebec is second with 319 and British Columbia has 306.

The annual event was held May 28-30, 2010 and hosted by St. Catharines, Ontario at Parkway Lanes.

Provincial teams of girls and boys included a bantam, junior, intermediate and senior bowler. All competitors earned their place on the team through provincial qualifying events.

The competition in boys and girl's singles, mixed doubles and mixed team is conducted in match play round robin style. All-events winners are awarded in each division as well as a team all events.

Jordon Jung, Vancouver, BC, Melissa Courchesne, Carignan, QC, Graham Fach, Guelph, ON and Danielle Lemoine, Winnipeg, MB earned the right to represent Canada at the Tournament of the Americas. They were the highest all events scores for those who had not reached 20 years of age as of January 2010.

The Tournament of the Americas will be held in Orlando, Florida, August 1 – 7, 2010.

Teryn Burgess, the senior girl from Saskatchewan, was awarded the Chris Tucker Memorial Sportsmanship award for the girls. Austyn Ducharme, the bantam boy from Manitoba earned the Ivan Nelson Memorial Sportsmanship award for the boys.
